# 10. Clerk updates:

- a) Discussion/Action regarding municipal rentals reservations. Kosmer informed the council that the office is struggling a little bit with how far in advance people can rent out the facilities. Right now they are doing January 1<sup>st</sup> of each year the rental calendar opens and then its first come first serve. This does not apply to Chamber hosted events or weddings at the facilities. It was suggested that perhaps people would be allowed to rent it on a 12 month basis.
- 11. Discussion/Action regarding review of 2025 City Fee Schedule

Discussion on mowing fees, it was questioned if we should increase them; however, the police department recently started giving citations for ordinance violations and actually putting the mowing fee as a restitution item instead of the City billing it. We will leave the mowing fees as they are for now and see how this new process goes. Discussion on all rental fees for the facilities. We will increase the rental for the pavilions, and band shell and training room. Docks and camping fees will remain the same.

12. DPW and Water/Sewer Updates:

DPW: just been getting ready for winter

Water/sewer: treatment plant has been running good and water system has been running good. Sent out letter regarding type of laterals going into the homes, the EPA is getting really strict about galvanized pipes, so we are sending a letter about their galvanized pipes and why the EPA wants the pipes changed. People can refuse to replace the pipes, but they have to sign off, we really only got about 300 surveys back when we asked about the type of lines going into the homes, this is an EPA federal program. Water/Sewer will be trying to post notes on doors to get people to call us, and a lot of rentals. Toelle suggested if we do redo Avon, we could job it in and run the stuff right to the house instead of just to the curb stop. A lot of the city lines have been replaced after 86 after they stopped the use of galvanized lines. Stoffel indicated that if you put in service right to the house you have to bill it to the homeowner because the PSC states your water utility cannot pay for work done to private places. So they are working to get all the information about all the laterals coming into the homes to report to the EPA.

- 13. Fifield/Ash Street Reconstruction Updates: Justin, this is to catch them up for final quantities except for the final lift. The change order is a requirement to change all quantities to actual for the project.

- 14. Discussion/ Potential Action regarding Water/Sewer connection at property located at 216 S Eyder Ave requested William Nemec.

Bill Nemec was in attendance to discuss water/sewer connection at the property he purchased on S Eyder Ave. Asking for consideration for the city to extend water/sewer to his lot, if not if he can use

the City's utility easement to run the lines to his property. Would like to rebuilt his home that was destroyed in a fire last December. Looking to get approval to run through the existing City utility easement to run his lines. This would run in the City's Road right of way on Eyder Street coming off the hookup on maple. Nemec would then be responsible for all the way to maple as a private line, but then he does not have to worry about getting a private easement from the house on the Corner of Maple and Eyder.

Heitkemper/Brzeskiewicz moved to recommend to the Common council to approve allowing William Nemec to run a private water/sewer line within the City's Road right-of-way on S Eyder Ave from Maple St to his property on 216 S Eyder. Carried

- 15. Fire Department updates: Chassis is still on schedule for being built for the end of the month. Working on getting the equipment ordered for the truck. Got a new UTV that was purchased with fundraiser funds, and they got the trailer ordered. Junior firefighter just finished his fire fighter 1 course and then he is going to take the state test to get State certified, and they just got another application for another junior firefighter.

Chief Hauschild met with the building owner on S Avon and thanked him for removing the property. 234 Shaw property will be coming down this week. 354 S Avon is now the City's and Heizler has been in touch with Xcel to get the lines removed and disconnected and then they will get things set up to take down that house.

New truck was picked up on Monday and they got it down to Belco so hoping it will be back and on the road next week.

The intern is doing well, thinks he would be a great fit, he is going to enroll to a 2 year college and then Hauschild agreed to sponsor him through the academy upon completion of program.

Neil Holm is going to retire at the end of December, so we have an ad out. Hoping to have interviews in January.

17. Discussion/Action regarding 2025 Water/Sewer Budget. Kosmer provided the numbers to the Council and indicated right now there is not an increase but the percentage increase is to adjust for the actual rate increase that was approved by the PSC that was effective 3/1/24. The 2024 budget only had a 2% increase for water rates when an 8% was approved, so that is why the see the 6 percent increase for the water rates. Kosmer questioned in the council would like to file another simplified rate case to increase rates that would be effective 3/1/25 and they agreed to do so. They also will do a 2% increase for sewer rates.

Clark/Klimowski moved to approve the 2025 Water/Sewer Budget with a simplified rate case to be filed to increase water and potentially fire rates and a 2% increase to sewer rates. Carried
